₩2024 4-H POSTER CONTEST RULES ₩

1. 4-H Poster may be completed at school or at home by 4-H youth. Parents/others may help youth with design only, but should not do the work for the youth.

2. 4-H Poster must be on 14"x11" poster board ONLY – A white poster board is will be supplied FREE in $4-6^{th}$ grade classrooms county-wide or may be picked up at the Extension Office located at 1337 Clay Street in Harford. Youth may purchase and use other colors of poster board at their own expense.

3. The 4-H poster must have a 4-H Theme incorporated into the design. The 4-H Clover ***** or the words "4-H" <u>must be</u> on the poster at least once.

4. Youth may draw or use clip art/stencils in the design of the 4-H poster. Crayons, markers, paint, colored pencils and/or stickon letters, clip art, etc. may be used, glued, or attached to the poster.

5. 4-H member's <u>full name, teacher, grade and school</u> should be printed neatly on back of the 4-H poster. Name should not be on front of poster.

<u>ITEMS NOT ALLOWED – (Ineligible for Champion</u> <u>consideration)</u>

1. No glitter of <u>any kind</u> is allowed (pen, loose glitter or glitter stickers).

2. 4-H Poster cannot be 3-D. Items on poster can be no higher than 1/8". Decorations/designs cannot hang over the edge of the poster board.

3. 4-H Poster is wrong size/type poster board, messy, folded or rolled up, or does not have full name on the poster – will receive ribbon only.

NO COPYRIGHTED MATERIAL OF ANY TYPE: (Poster will be disqualified)

- Sports Teams - College or Professional, etc.

- NASCAR - No Drivers or Sponsors names, etc.

- Product Names Nike, Pepsi, M&M, etc.
- Cartoon Characters Sponge Bob, Bugs Bunny, etc.

- Singers/Actors/Movies - Pirates of Caribbean, Shrek,

etc.

AWARDS – Judging will take place by grades.

1. 4-H participants will receive a 4-H ribbon (blue/red/green) 2. 4-6 grade classroom will have a room champion (Purple rosette ribbon).

3. Each school will have a school champion for 4^{th} 5^{th} , and 6^{th} grades that will receive a trophy.

4. One County Champion will be selected for each grade level from all School champions. A trophy will be awarded to each of the County Champions in 4^{th} , 5^{th} , 6^{th} grades. Home school youth (4th-6th) and Teens will be placed in separate county groups. A trophy will be awarded to each group.

Contest deadline: 4-H posters are due at the October 4-H School or Community club meeting or to the Extension Office by October 31. School Club deadlines may be set by a 4-H classroom teacher.

4-H Cupcake Wars: Showcases creativity and design skills of 4-H youth.

Where: Ohio County Fair (Ohio County Park)

Who: A team of one to two 4-H members ages 9-18.

Cost: Free admission to OC fair air for one youth and guardian. Does not include rides or paid events.

Date: Friday, September 13, 6:00 pm. Teams must check-in 30 minutes prior to contest (5:30 pm)

4-H Cupcake Designers: Each team of 1-2 youth will receive 2 cupcakes to decorate. Each team must bring all supplies (icing, decorations, props, table decorations, table cloth, etc.) to decorate the two cupcakes. Additional cupcakes are not allowed to be used in the presentation. Any decorating media is allowed. A table top design area will be provided that measures 36 inches x 30 inches. Individuals/teams will have 30 minutes to incorporate the two cupcakes into a design of their choice. The provided two cupcakes must be included in the finished presentation. Only participants can set up display or decorate cupcakes before and during competition. Judge's decisions are final.

- Awards: Grand Champion \$20 cash & Trophy, Reserve Champion - \$15 & Trophy, Best Display - \$10 & Trophy, Most Original - \$10 & Trophy, Best Design Skills - \$10 & Trophy. All participants will receive ribbons/premium based on the Danish System.


